

Irve J. Goldman Receives CLABBY Award from the Connecticut Bar Association

Irve J. Goldman, an attorney who has practiced bankruptcy law and commercial litigation for more than 20 years, was one of three attorneys who received a CLABBY award from the Connecticut Bar Association's Commercial Law and Bankruptcy Section on Tuesday, May 1.

Mr. Goldman was the first attorney in Connecticut to become a certified specialist in business bankruptcy and has represented a diversity of interests in bankruptcy proceedings, including companies reorganizing under Chapter 11, secured creditors, equipment lessors, franchisees, landlords and other creditor groups and asset purchasers in 363 sales.
