Among the greatest concerns remains the lack of clear direction from state agencies such as the Social Equity Council and Department of Consumer Protection, as well as from federal regulatory authorities like the SEC. What is certain, according to our attorneys, is that potential players and interested parties should expect to navigate a complicated process as guidance surrounding applicant qualifications, licensing, zoning, and employer rights and responsibilities continues to develop.
